This instrument was commissioned and featured during the **Grand Opening of Bee Gees Way** in Redcliffe, Queensland, Australia in September 2015. The instrument was hand-crafted and hand-painted by **Michael Connolly (Munda-gutta Kulliwari)**. Mr Connolly was the featured Didgeridoo performer for the official ceremony and presentation, playing this specific instrument for **Sir Barry Gibb** and gathered dignitaries and public.

Following the performance at the Bee Gees statues, Sir Barry Gibb personally signed this instrument on-site. This signature was given as a gesture of profound respect between a global musical icon and Indigenous Australian Culture.

| Statement from the Artist

I want you to know exactly how special this moment was. In 2015, the Redcliffe Council opened Bee Gees Way, and I was invited to play the didgeridoo as part of the official presentation.
